An acceptable description may include:

- Accusations of electoral fraud
- Concern about Putin's consolidation of power
- Complaints about corruption in and around the Kremlin
- Concern about Orthodox Church support for Putin
- Opposition candidate harassment

One point is earned for EACH correct explanation of a reason why the 2011 and 2012 protests had a limited political impact.

An acceptable explanation may include:

- State-controlled media
- Popular support of Putin
- Selective reprisals against protestors
- Weak civil society
- Consolidation of the political elite
- Strong economy
- New legislation to limit protests

A score of zero (0) is earned for an attempted answer that earns no points or for an off-task answer.

2. Describe one cause of the protests that occurred in Russia in 2011 and 2012. Explain

One cause of the protests in Russia in 2011/2012 was
evidence of electoral fraud and corruption during its
presidential elections. In many regions, there was evidence
of ballot-box stuffing because polls showed that Puti
had over 150 70 of the vote. Many protested that these
elections being conducted were supposed to be democratic
however they were rigged. Although, these protests were
not effective because Putis authoritarian system
easily quiets any opposition or protest, basically anything
that is a threat to his power. Also, another reason is
because he already has a great deal of legitimary
because not only is he a strong and charismatic leader but
he uses rational-legal means (following constitutional
wees regarding presidency) to legitimize is leadership.
The Russian public for the most part has been very content
with now Putin has governed Russia and so the electoral
fraud has minimal effect on Putin's election.

2. Describe one cause of the protests that occurred in Russia in 2011 and 2012. Explain two reasons why the protests had a limited political impact.

Hotests that took place in Plussia recently

term. Protests including this one had a limited
term impact because the change was not
effective via a protest.

Question 2

Overview

The intent of this question was to assess students' understanding of the 2011–2012 Russian protest movement, and the reasons why those protests had a limited impact. The skills tested were descriptive and explanatory. Students had three specific tasks: to describe one cause of the protests that occurred in Russia in 2011 and 2012 and to give two explanations (two tasks) for why those protests had limited political impact.

Sample: 2A Score: 3

The response earned 1 point for correctly describing that the "protests mainly occurred due to the voting results of that year's election, which ... seemed statistically suspicious." The response earned 1 point for explaining that the protests had little impact because "the government controls the media" and 1 point because "Putin has a high popularity rating."

Sample: 2B Score: 2

The response earned 1 point for correctly describing that the protests occurred because of "evidence of electoral fraud and corruption during its presidential elections." The response earned 1 point for explaining that the protests had little impact because "the Russian public for the most part has been very content with how Putin has governed Russia." The response did not earn a second explanation point.

Sample: 2C Score: 1

The response earned 1 point for correctly describing that the protests "had to do with the political corruption of how Putin won another term." The response did not earn any points for explaining why those protests had a limited political impact.
